2 Corinthians 8

1. 8:16 The same concern I have for you.
2. 8:18 For his service to the gospel.
3. 8:21 What is right, not only in the eyes of the Lord but also in the eyes of men.
4. 8:24 So that the churches can see it.

2 Corinthians 9

1. 9:1-2 For I know your eagerness to help.
2. 9:6 Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.

2 Corinthians 12

1. 12:4,3 This man who was caught up to paradise (he).
2. 12:6 So no one will think more of me than is warranted by what I do or say.
3. 12:7 To torment me, to keep me from becoming conceited because of these surpassingly great revelations.
4. 12:9 For my power is made perfect in weakness.
5. 12:9 So that Christ's power may rest on me.
6. 12:10 For when I am weak then I am strong.
7. 12:12 Signs, wonders and miracles.
8. 12:14 Because what I want is not your possessions but you.
9. 12:21 That when I come again my God will humble me before you, and I will be grieved over many who have sinned earlier and have not repented of the impurity, sexual sin and debauchery in which they have indulged.

2 Corinthians 13
