Luke 10

1. 10:25 Who: An expert in the law; To: Jesus; Why: To test him.
2. 10:27 With all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind.
3. 10:29,25 Who: An expert in the law; To: Jesus; Why: He wanted to justify himself.
4. 10:35,33,30 Who: A Samaritan; To: The innkeeper; About: The man who fell into the hands of robbers.
5. 10:36-37,25 Who: Jesus; To: The expert in the law; Reply: "The one who had mercy on him".
6. 10:40 Martha.

Luke 11

1. 11:2-4 Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us. And lead us not into temptation.
2. 11:4 For we also forgive everyone who sins against us.
3. 11:8 Because of the man's boldness.
4. 11:13 How much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!.
5. 11:15,14 Who: Some of the crowd; About: Jesus; In response to: Jesus driving out a mute demon.
6. 11:18 How can his kingdom stand?.
7. 11:21 When a strong man, fully armed, guards his own house.
8. 11:24 Who: An evil spirit; When: It comes out of a man and goes through arid places seeking rest and does not find it.
9. 11:28 Those who hear the word of God and obey it.
10. 11:30 As Jonah was a sign to the Ninevites.
11. 11:31 For she came from the ends of the earth to listen to Solomon's wisdom, and now one greater than Solomon is here.
12. 11:32 For they repented at the preaching of Jonah, and now one greater than Jonah is here.
13. 11:39,38 Who: Jesus (the Lord); To: the Pharisee who invited him to eat with him; When: he was surprised, noticing that Jesus did not first wash before the meal.
14. 11:43 You Pharisees.
15. 11:46 You experts in the law.
16. 11:50-51 The blood of all the prophets that has been shed since the beginning of the world, from the blood of Abel to the blood of Zechariah, who was killed between the altar and the sanctuary.
17. 11:53-54 Waiting to catch him in something he might say.

Luke 13

1. 13:3,5 Unless you repent.
2. 13:6 On a fig tree he had, planted in his vineyard.
3. 13:12,11,13 Who: Jesus; To: The woman who had been crippled by a spirit for eighteen years; What: He put his hands on her, and immediately she straightened up and praised God.
4. 13:14 Who: The synagogue ruler; To: The people; Why: (he was) indignant because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath.
5. 13:19 A mustard seed which a man took and planted in his garden.
6. 13:21,20 The kingdom of God.
7. 13:24 Because many will try to enter and will not be able to.
8. 13:28 When you see Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, but you yourselves thrown out.
9. 13:29 To take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.
10. 13:34 As a hen gathers her chicks under her wings.
11. 13:35 Desolate.

Luke 14

1. 14:1 One Sabbath, when he went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee.
2. 14:5,6,3 Who: Jesus; To: the Pharisees and experts in the law; Response: They had nothing to say.
3. 14:8 For a person more distinguished than you may have been invited.
4. 14:11 Everyone who exalts himself.
5. 14:13-14 Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.
6. 14:17-18 Who: the servant of the man preparing a great banquet; To: those who had been invited; Response: they all alike began to make excuses.
7. 14:24 Not one of those men who were invited will get a taste of my banquet.
8. 14:26 Anyone who comes to me and does not hate his father and mother, his wife and children, his brothers and sisters--yes, even his own life.
9. 14:29-30 Everyone who sees it will ridicule him, saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish".
10. 14:32 One who considers that with ten thousand men he is not able to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand.
11. 14:34-35 How can it be made salty again? It is fit neither for the soil nor for the manure pile; it is thrown out.
