Luke 4

1. 4:4,3 Who: Jesus; To: the devil; In reply to: "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread".
2. 4:8,6-7 Who: Jesus; In response to: The devil saying "I will give you all their authority and splendor, for it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. So if you worship me, it will all be yours".
3. 4:12,9 Who: Jesus; In response to: the devil.
4. 4:13 An opportune time.
5. 4:17 The scroll of the prophet Isaiah.
6. 4:24 In his hometown.
7. 4:26 Elijah.
8. 4:29 In order to throw him down the cliff.
9. 4:32 Because his message had authority.
10. 4:34,31,33 Who: The man possessed by a demon, an evil spirit; Where: In the synagogue in Capernaum; How: Cried out at the top of his voice.
11. 4:36,35,37 Who: All the people; About: Jesus; What happened: The news about him spread throughout the surrounding area.
12. 4:43 Because that is why I was sent.

Luke 5

1. 5:5,6,1 Who: Simon; To: Jesus; What: When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break.
2. 5:8,7 Who: Simon Peter; When: When he saw both boats filled so full that they began to sink; How: He fell at Jesus' knees.
3. 5:10-11 Who: Jesus; To: Simon; What: So they pulled up their boats on shore, left everything and followed him.
4. 5:12 A man with leprosy.
5. 5:20-21 Who: Jesus; When: When he saw their faith; What: The Pharisees and the teachers of the law began thinking to themselves, "Who is this fellow who speaks blasphemy? Who can forgive sins but God alone?".
6. 5:24 That the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins.
7. 5:29 Levi.
8. 5:30,29,31-32 Who: The Pharisees and the teachers of the law who belonged to their sect; To: Jesus' disciples; Reply: "It is not the healthy who need a doctor but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance".
9. 5:35,34 When the bridegroom will be taken away from his guests (them).
10. 5:36 If he does, he will have torn the new garment, and the patch from the new will not match the old.
11. 5:37 If he does the new wine will burst the skins, the wine will run out and the wineskins will be ruined.

1. 6:4,3 David.
2. 6:7 The Pharisees and the teachers of the law were looking for a reason to accuse Jesus.
3. 6:9,7-8 Who: Jesus; To: The Pharisees and the teachers of the law; When: The man with the shriveled hand got up and stood in front of everyone.
4. 6:13-16 12 of his disciples whom he chose: Simon (whom he named Peter), his brother Andrew, James, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James son of Alphaeus, Simon who was called the Zealot, Judas son of James, and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor.
5. 6:17-18 12 To hear Jesus (him) and to be healed of their diseases.
6. 6:20 For yours is the kingdom of God.
7. 6:22 When men hate you, when they exclude you and insult you and reject your name as evil, because of the Son of Man.
8. 6:26 For that is how their fathers treated the false prophets.
